WHEREAS, the Washington Talking Book & Braille Library helps build connections, opportunities, and personal and professional growth through free and equal access to information, and through partnerships with local disability organizations to foster a life long love of reading from birth to end of life; and

WHEREAS, the programs and services offered by the Washington Talking Book & Braille Library contribute significantly to meeting the needs of individuals with disabilities and the disability community at large: free library service to any resident unable to read standard print material, locally produced audio and braille books, volunteer and professional development opportunities, education and training, youth and family programs, book clubs, author interviews, programs and events, advocacy; and
