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Instructions

This exam is one component of Election Administrator Certification. The exam allows you to demonstrate your knowledge of election law and your ability to apply the Revised Code of Washington, the Washington Administrative Code, and other pertinent source documents.

This exam is designed as an open book test. It consists of five sections: multiple choice, fill in the blank, ordering, voter intent, and short answer. Group work is acceptable for the first four sections. You must complete the short answer section individually.

In all sections, points are awarded separately: One point is for a correct citation supporting your response, and the balance of points are for the correct answer.

All citations should reference an RCW, WAC, or other state or federal law. Except when directed otherwise, the citation should refer to a specific section of law (e.g., "Washington Constitution Article I Section 19," "RCW 29A.04.001," or "WAC 434-208-060"). References to training materials, clearinghouses, or other similar sources are considered incorrect citations. You may supply more than one citation, and points are not deducted for incorrect citations, as long as your answer includes the correct citation. Check to make sure your citation answers the question directly. Some questions require more than one citation.

In the fourth section, provide a detailed response and include the supporting citation(s). Use your own words to write your response. Do not quote the language from the applicable RCW, WAC, or other statute as your response. The evaluator will ignore quoted statutes.

Please read and consider each question carefully before answering. Record your answers directly onto the test booklet. There are 203 possible points. An 80% score, or 163 points, is required to pass the exam.
