BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON

The Fish and Wildlife Commission shall be elected by statewide elections to a six year term in the general election to a six year term at the General Election in even years. Commissioners are to serve until their successors are elected and qualified and the term shall commence on the Wednesday after the second Monday of January following the election.

The official Fish and Wildlife Commission must assume office immediately upon their election and qualification. Staggering of terms must be accomplished as follows;[1] The three persons elected receiving the most number of votes are elected to a six year term of office. The three persons receiving the next greatest number of votes are elected to 4 year terms of office; And the three persons receiving the next highest number of votes are elected to a 2 year term of office.

[2]If a vacancy occurs the Commission shall function with only 8 members until the following general election. If necessary putting off legislation.

[3] There shall be no favoritism shown pertaining to the location of the residency of Commissioners. Elections are to be strictly by one man or woman one vote..

Persons elegible for election as members of the Commission shall have general knowledge of the habits and distribution of Fish and Wildlife and shall not hold another State, County or municipal elective job, nor be in line to directly benefit from their position as a Commissioner.

Commissioners shall be paid 400\$ a day when they work.

2]The method of choosing Fish and Wildlife Commissioners is contrary to American Democracy which stipulates One Man One Vote.. People who are forced to live in populated areas to earn a living should not have their influence denied by a corruptible system which creates rule by the minority rather than majority rule. Now Special Interests are in control of the People's Fish in the State of Washingtom. By having democratically elected Commissioners the "People" will regain that which has been taken from them.
