There are two Special Election dates each year: The second Tuesday in February and the fourth Tuesday in April.

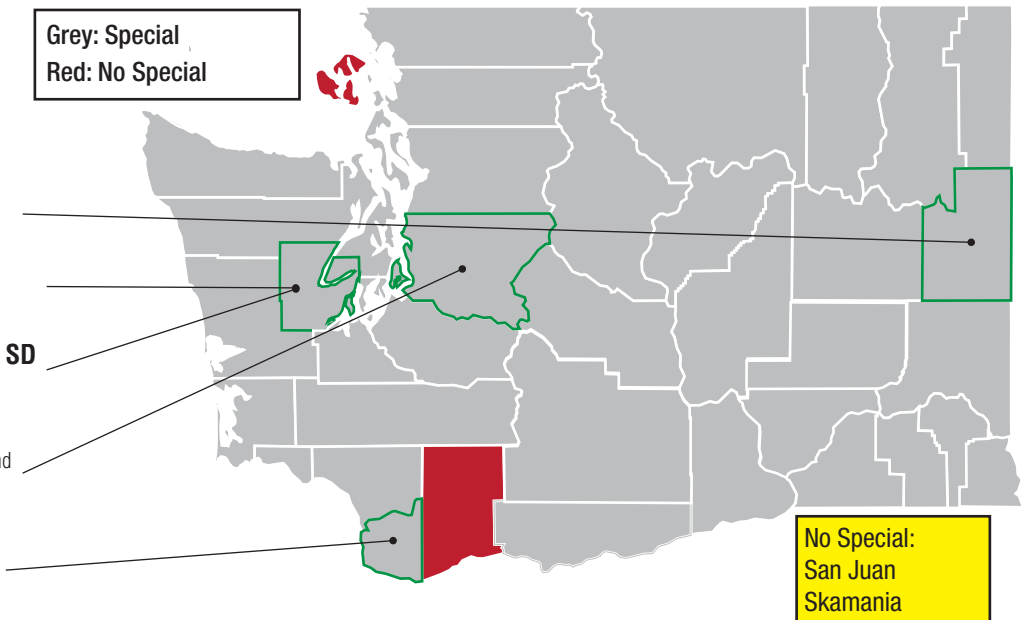
