Pat Kelly Asserts Court Should * * * * * Let Him Down "Easy" Because He * * * * * Spent St. Patrick's Day in Jail

Pat Kelly indicated to the court this morning that because he was in jail last night and did not get to celebrate St. Patrick's day with speed becoming to his nationality, he should get off easier. But on his plea of guilty to possession with intent to sell he was fined \$250 and sentenced to jail for sixty days, despite that he already had been in the county bastille since January 23.

Police Officer Art Evensen told Judge Brown that Kelly was arrested after he had a ld liquor to a stool pigeon, and also to two boys who frequented the Y. M. C. A. and were over 16 and not 18 years of age. The boys were captured with a full quart of moonshine and a part of a quart, the officer said, and they told where they had obtained it.

Prosecuting Attorney Loom's Baldrey charged the man with being a jointist, but it is understood that for technical reasons the charge was reduced to the one pleaded to. It was stated Kelly's "legal name" was Patrick Walter Kelly.
