STIPULATION AND ORDER TO AMEND PIID OF I-2124

[PROPOSED]

I. STIPULATION

Petitioner No on 2124, Sponsor Jim Walsh, and the Attorney General ("Parties") hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

- 1. Jim Walsh is the sponsor of Initiative Measure No. 2124 ("Initiative" or "I-2124").
- 2. Under RCW 29A.72.027, Washington voters are entitled to a disclosure on the ballot reflecting the impact a ballot measure will have on public investments. For any ballot measure that (1) "[r]epeals, levies, or modifies any tax or fee" and (2) has "a fiscal impact statement . . . that shows that adoption of the measure would cause a net change in state revenue." RCW 29A.72.027(1). This disclosure is known as a public investment impact disclosure or "PIID."
- 3. The Attorney General is tasked with initially drafting any ballot measure's PIID, subject to review and final resolution by this Court. *See* RCW 29A.72.027, .028.

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- 4. On July 8, 2024, the Attorney General filed with the Secretary of State a proposed PIID for I-2124 stating, "This measure would decrease funding for Washington's public insurance program for persons requiring long term care."
- 5. On July 11, 2024, Petitioner filed a petition appealing the Attorney General's proposed PIID. On July 17, 2024, Petitioner filed its Opening Brief, and on July 22, 2024, the Attorney General and Sponsor filed their Response Briefs.
- 6. The Parties have reached an agreement on an alternative PIID formulation that is accurate, neutral, and satisfies the statutory requirements governing PIIDs. The alternative is:

This measure would decrease funding for Washington's public insurance program providing long-term care benefits and services.

- 7. In stipulating to this alternative PIID, Sponsor does not waive any aspect of his position that the PIID statute does not permit a PIID for I-2124. *See generally Walsh v. Hobbs*, No. 24-2-01702-34 (Thurston Cnty. Sup. Ct.); *Walsh v. Hobbs*, No. 103174-2 (Washington Supreme Court). Sponsor stipulates to this alternative PIID in the event the courts do not block a PIID from being certified for I-2124.
- 8. The Parties respectfully request that the Court enter an order adopting the agreedupon PIID. The PIID would appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

AS PRESENTED ON THE BALLOT

Initiative Measure No. 2124 concerns state long-term care insurance. This measure would provide that employees and self-employed people must elect to keep coverage under RCW 50B.04 and could opt-out any time. It would repeal a law governing an exemption for employees.

This measure would decrease funding for Washington's public insurance program providing long-term care benefits and services.
