



October 18 - Deadline for ballots to be mailed to voters

October 28 - Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

October 29 - USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back one week before Election Day

November 5 — Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote in person by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be postmarked by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

November 26 - County Canvassing Boards certify General Election results

December 5 — Last day for Secretary of State to certify General Election results

December 17 — Electoral College casts votes
