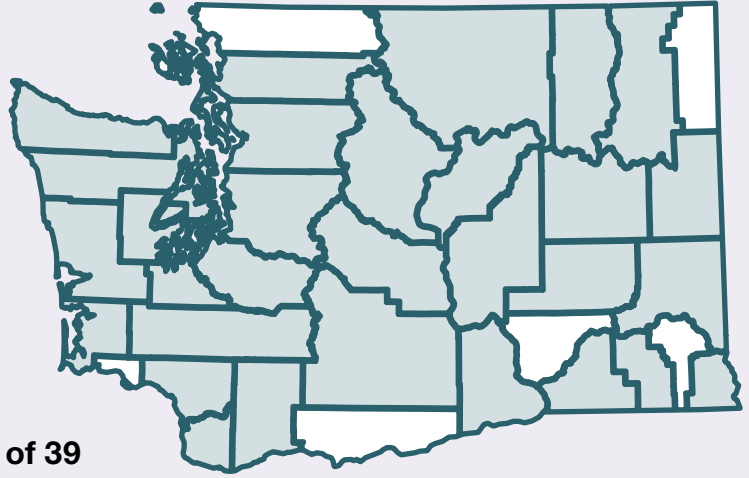

## What is a Special Election?

Special elections are called when registered voters in counties or local communities need to vote on local offices, questions, bonds, levies, or other measures.

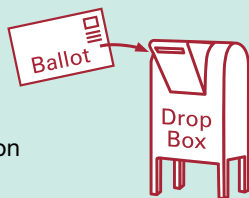

Many drop boxes are open 24/7 during the voting period and all close promptly at 8 p.m. on election day, February 11.

## Key dates



**January 24** — Start of voting period and deadline for counties to mail out ballots to voters

**February 3** — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

**February 4** — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back at least one week before election day

**February 11** — Special Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote in person by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be postmarked by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

**February 21** — County Canvassing Boards certify results
